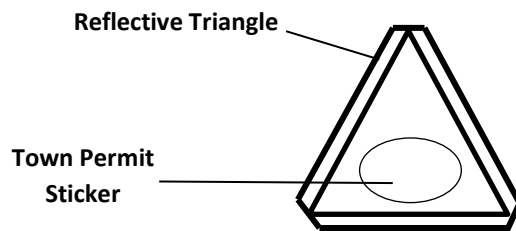


Permit to operate a Golf Cart as a Mobility Device in the Town of Oak Island

Procedure:

1. Complete the “Application for Permit to Operate a Mobility Device” and return it to the Oak Island Police Department. Along with the application, the owner of the golf cart must provide the following: Proof of ownership, a valid Driver’s License and Proof of Insurance at the time of registration.
2. The Applicant must Read and Sign the “Disclaimer of Liability” regarding the use and operation of golf carts as a Mobility Device.
3. The applicant must trailer the golf cart to the Police Department so that an officer can view the cart as necessary for the inspection.
4. Once the application is completed and approved, the applicant will then be required to pay a registration fee of **\$5.00** and will be issued a permit sticker. *** Note- The Customer Service Department will not accept payment or issue a permit sticker unless the application has been signed by a member of the Police Department Administration. ***
5. Once the applicant is issued the permit sticker, the applicant should attach the permit sticker as instructed below. The permit sticker is to be affixed to the center of the reflective triangle (that is mounted to the rear of the golf cart.)



Important things to Remember:

- All permits expire on December 31 of the year in which they are issued. A new application and permit is required each year.
- Permits to operate a golf cart as a Mobility Device can only be obtained when both the Oak Island Town Hall and the Oak Island Police Department are open.
- This sticker is NOT to be used for parking in designated town resident parking places. A separate application must be completed and a separate fee must be paid in order to obtain a resident parking permit.
- The permit will also allow the operator to use their mobility device on the beach strand as provided by Town of Oak Island Ordinance 28-6. A copy of that ordinance is attached to this document.
- A copy of the proof of ownership, liability insurance, and a completed Disclaimer of Liability must be in the cart at all times when the cart is in use on public property.

Disclaimer of Liability:

This Town of Oak Island ordinance authorizing the use of golf carts as a mobility device on public streets and public vehicular areas by individuals with mobility impairments is adopted to address the interest of public safety under the provisions of N.C.G.S 160A-300.6 which provides the Town of Oak Island authority to regulate the use of golf carts in the town that have not been outfitted and registered as required by state law. Generally, golf carts that have not been outfitted and registered are not designated or manufactured to be used on other than golf courses, and the Town of Oak Island in no way advocates or endorses their operation elsewhere in town. The town, by regulating such operation is merely trying to address obvious safety issues, and adoption of this chapter is not to be relied upon as a determination that operation is safe or advisable if done in accordance with this chapter.

All persons who operate or ride upon golf carts do so at their own risk and peril, and must be observant of, and attentive to the safety of themselves and others, including their passengers, other motorists, bicyclists, and pedestrians. The Town of Oak Island has no liability under any theory of liability, for permitting golf carts to be operated in town.

The owner and operator of a golf cart are responsible for any liability involved in using a golf cart. Without the adoption of standards for operation on private streets, there are currently no rules or regulations that address golf cart operation and by creating standards for limited operation on the private streets within Oak Island, the town is responding to citizen concerns regarding operation deficiencies. These regulations impose more stringent policies on cart operation. The town does not encourage golf cart operation and does not represent that operation of golf carts under these rules will render golf cart operation safe and without risk to the driver and passengers of said golf carts.

By my signature below, I confirm that I have read and understand the DISCLAIMER above, and agree to indemnify and hold harmless the Town of Oak Island, its officers, managers, agents, employees, successors and/or other affiliated persons free from any liability in connection with any use of a golf cart on a public street or public vehicular area in the Town of Oak Island, North Carolina. Further, I agree to be responsible for any person who operates any golf cart on a public street or public vehicular area in the Town of Oak Island, North Carolina.

Copy of 28-6 Allowing Beach Access

Sec. 28-6 Exception for motorized wheelchairs.

Notwithstanding the restricted areas listed in Section 28-5, person(s) who have been issued a state handicapped permit and/or a permanent handicapped registration plate and a permit issued by the town police department may operate an approved beach accessible vehicle on the beach in designated areas. Operation is permitted by the permit holder or his/her designated driver who shall at all times operate in a safe and prudent manner, who shall give way to pedestrians at all times and who shall give warning before starting, stopping, turning his/her vehicle and remain clear of the federally-protected turtle nesting area. The number of passengers shall be limited to the design of the approved vehicle.

Operation is limited to:

1. The last beach access on West Beach Drive and west to a point as designated by signage reflecting no further vehicle traffic;
2. From 58th Street to 69th Street SE;
3. From dawn to dusk.
